Wishing each of you a Happy Thanksgiving and a Blessed Christmas.



Did you know that the Lions of District 5M11 (You!) have donated over \$100,000 to various causes since July 1st, 2022? Way to go LIONS!

Dear CC Glenn and Members of the 2022-23 Council of Governors.

I write as Chairman of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation to ask the MD5M Council to add the TEAM Sheehan Foundation to the list of Service Activities found on pages 6 and 7 of Chapter 1 A 5 in the MD5M Policy Manual.

The TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation was formed on March 17, 2022 and received its 501c3 designation on June 23, 2022.

The Foundation has a 13 member Board of Directors with staggered terms consisting of myself (5M6), Vice Chair PID Bruce Beck(5M9), Secretary PDG Joan Blank (5M2), Treasurer PDG Marty Athmann (Bird Island Lions Club), PCC Earl Orvik (5M1), PDG Vickie Radloff (5M3), PDG Kent Biessel (5M4), PDG Rob Rand (5M5), PDG Pat Kennedy (5M7), PDG Donna Mae Landwehr (5M8), PDG Larry Winner (5M10), Lion Jenifer Spielman (5M11) and PDG Cheryl McKitrick (5M13), as well as Advisers Lori and Brian Sheehan.

In the past, LCI Presidents were presented extravagant gifts at the end of their terms by their Multiple District to thank them for their leadership and service. Recent examples have included a car, a tree with leaves of gold, and a golf cart and club membership. You may recall that IPIP Doug Alexander received a check in the amount of \$50,000 from the Lions of New York to be distributed to charity(s) of his choice.

Lion Brian has made it clear he does NOT want a present. He's asked us to set up a charity that would help Lions. That is what we have done and are funding; hopefully with the help of Lions and clubs in MD5M.

The TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation's mission is to help local Lions clubs fund projects and activities with matching grants; at least initially of \$3,000 or less. These activities are usually too small to be considered for LCIF grants. One of our goals is to build sufficient funds to use earnings only to purchase awards, such as medals or pins, as acknowledgments of contributions.

Unfortunately, since the LCI Board of Directors is meeting at the same time as your Council of Governors meeting, the only member of our Executive Committee that will be able to attend the October CoG meeting is Treasurer Marty Athmann who will be there to answer any questions you may have.

With the Council's endorsement, the Foundation is hoping it will be considered in Clubs Parade of Green at their Mid-winter conventions. IRS regulations require the Foundation to take in less than \$50,000 a year during its first 3 years and the Foundation's first year ended June 30, 2022. This means it is not looking for large contributions, perhaps an average of \$4,000 per district or less than \$100 per club.


